These include wildlife and the countryside; the design and development of our towns and neighbourhoods; our use of energy and transport; the quality of our air, water and land; the way we deal with our waste; and environmental education and action.



Working for change

Swansea Environmental Forum promotes and facilitates environmental sustainability in Swansea. It works to:

- influence policy and action

- develop and support environmental projects and innovation
- provide expertise, collate evidence and highlight priority areas for action.

Working with vision

Our vision is ambitious and presents a Swansea where the natural environment we inherited is safeguarded and improved for the future; where the built environment is inspiring and supports communities; where local people have better opportunities for work, learning and leisure, but the quality of life of others around the world is also respected; and where everyone understands and values the environment and tries to live more sustainably.

Achieving success

Swansea Environmental Forum has an impressive track record of initiating and delivering innovative projects, organising successful events and producing useful and informative resources. Key achievements include:

The Environment Centre – opened in 1995 by HRH the Prince of Wales, this is a unique focal point for environmental information, education and activity in south-west Wales.

Sustainable Swansea – an awareness-raising initiative, launched in 2004, that engages communities, organisations and the public in projects that help make Swansea a more sustainable place to live, work and visit.

Swansea Environment Strategy – published in 2006 and entitled 'Time to Change', this landmark document sets out an ambitious vision for Swansea and a plan of action for getting there.

Earth from the Air – this internationally renowned exhibition was brought to Swansea in 2007 through a broad partnership co-ordinated by Swansea Environmental Forum, and captured the interest of 100,000 visitors.

Addressing the big issues

Swansea Environmental Forum is taking a lead with 5 big issues which form part of Swansea's community strategy. These big issues are:

- improving air quality
- preparing for climate change
- energy and carbon management
- achieving Blue Flag status for Swansea Bay
- protecting and promoting biodiversity.

Making significant progress in these areas may take several years and will require constructive and imaginative collaboration between many partners across different sectors.
